

# Czech Temporal Adjuncts

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## 2 types of Czech temporal adjuncts (TAs):

- I.      až do + NP<sub>—GEN</sub> ('until' + NP)  
*až do rána* ('until morning')
  
- II.     nejméně + NP<sub>—ACC</sub> ('at least' + NP)  
*nejméně hodinu* ('at least one hour')

# Basic observation I

*Petr dočetl knihu \*až do rána / nejméně hodinu.*

(‘Petr finished reading the book until morning /  
at least one hour.’)

dočetl → read: 3. Sg Past **Perf**

## Basic observation II

*Petr nedočetl knihu až do rána /nejméně hodinu.*

‘Petr didn’t finish reading the book until morning  
/ at least one hour.’

nedočetl → **NEG** read: 3. Sg Past **Perf**

# Two ways to deal the contrast

- A) TAs are NPIs  
(polarity hypothesis)
  
- B) TAs are aspectual sensitive  
(homogeneity hypothesis)

# Basic observation III

*Petr četl knihu až do rána / nejméně hodinu.*

- ‘Petr was reading the book until morning / at least one hour. ’

četl → read: 3.Sg Past **Impf**

# Corpus research: input

## Goal:

Precise the semantic context enabling TAs  
→ accurate definition

Instrument: SYN2010 (Czech National Corpus)  
cca 3 000 analyzed sentences with TAs  
(1 500 : 1 500)

# Corpus research: output

result:

TAs + imperfective PRED ✓

TAs + perfective PRED ✓  
ONLY ATELIC!

# Aspect

(i.e. Csirmaz 2006; Dočekal & Kučerová 2009)

- a) grammatical (external):      perfectivity
- b) lexical (internal):              telicity

## Telicity (von Stechow 2002):

only homogeneous predicates are atelic

$P$  is homogeneous iff  $P(t) : \forall t'[t' \subset t \rightarrow P(t')]$

# Homogeneity hypothesis

Data classification:

I. imperfective PRED – atelic      ✓

II. perfective PRED – 4 groups    (...)

# 1. Simple atelic predicates

...*nechám*                  *tu*                  *před branami*                  *až do poledne*  
leave: 1SG Pres Perf here      outside the gates      until the noon

(...) *skupinu vojáků.*

a group of soldiers

‘I will leave a group of soldiers outside the gates until noon.’

more predicates: *zůstat / setrvat* ‘to stay’, *strávit* ‘to spend’, *jít* ‘to go’, *uchovat* ‘to conserve’, *zabrat* ‘to take’

(...) *a stráví*                      *nejméně*              *hodinu*  
and spend: 3. Sg Pres Perf        at least                  hour

*v tichém meditování.*  
in silent meditation

‘(...) and [she] will spend at least an hour in silent  
meditation.’

## 2. Predicates with superlexical prefixes

***Povaříme***      **[jídlo]**      ***nejméně hodinu.***

cook: 1 Pl Pres Perf [*the dish*]      *for at least one hour.*

‘We will continue to cook [*the dish*] at least for an hour.’

more predicates: *přetrvat* ‘to be preserved’, *prožít* ‘to experience’, *pospat si* ‘to sleep in’, *podržet si* ‘to retain’...

*Husu                  jsme                  si                  ponechali*

goose: AccSg AUX 1. Pl REFL keep: PTC past, Pl, Masc

*až do dnešního rána.*

until today's morning

‘We have kept the goose until this morning.’

### 3. Modal above telic perfective

*Výstavu (...)*

exhibition: AccSg

**mohou**

can: 3Pl

*zájemci*

those interested: 1Pl

*navštívit*

visit: Inf Perf

*až do konce října.*

until the end of October.

‘Those interested can visit the exhibition until the end of October.’

$\exists$  x  $\forall$  contrast: *až do*

$\exists$  ✓ :

*Výstavu mohou zájemci navštívit až do konce října.*

‘Those interested can visit the exhibition until the end of October.’

$\forall$  \*:

\**Výstavu musí zájemci navštívit až do konce října.*

(‘Those interested must visit the exhibition until the end of October.’)

$\exists$  x  $\forall$  contrast: *nejméně*

$\forall$  ✓ :

*Karel Poborský se bude muset nejméně týden obejít bez fotbalu.*

‘K. P. will need at least a week to do without football.’

$\exists$  \*:

\**Karel Poborský se bude moci nejméně týden obejít bez fotbalu.*

(‘K. P. will be able to at least a week to do without football.’)

$\exists$  x  $\forall$  contrast: *až do x nejméně*

- až do + NP<sub>GEN</sub> ('until' + NP):                           $\exists \checkmark / \forall *$
- nejméně + NP<sub>ACC</sub> ('at least' + NP):                   $\exists * / \forall \checkmark$

## 4. Negation + telic perf. predicate

*Jeho zbytky (...)*

his:Acc remain: AccPl

*nikdo nenađde*

nobody NEG find: 3Sg Pres Perf

*nejméně dalších padesát tisíc let.*

at least next fifty thousands years

‘Nobody will find his remains at least next fifty thousands years.’

<i>Až do té</i>	<i>chvíle</i>	<i>si</i>	<i>toho</i>
until	moment		REFL that: Gen, Neu

*vůbec nevšimla.*

at all NEG notice: Past, PTC Perf, Sg, Fem

‘Until that moment she did not even notice.’

3. *dočetl* (read: 3. Sg Past **Perf**) → \*  
*nedočetl* (**NEG** read: 3. Sg Past **Perf**) → ✓  
*četl* (read: 3.Sg Past **Impf**) → ✓

# Summary II

**homogeneity** of the event:

I. **lexical semantics** (atelic →subinterval property)

- imperfectives
- simple atelic perfectives
- verbs with superlexical prefix

II. **compositionally** (PRED + operators →subint. property)

- modals
- negation

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
